Attended HMAS *Sydney 1* 100th anniversary commemorative service, assisted in writing the service in conjunction with Major Dennis McMillin.

Attended HMAS *Sydney 2* commemorative service, assisted in writing the service in conjunction with Major Dennis McMillin.

Attended Shipp Division graduation with David Dwyer, 6<sup>th</sup> March 2015.

Did life expectancy research with assistance from Steve Mika. Life expectancy for men aged 65 in 2010 could expect to live another 19 years (84). 59 of our members went way before their time at average age of 66.

Writeway Research Service. Issues of false and misleading information being used in their research. Members alerted to this.
